In this regard, **we encourage exhibitors to prepare the Power Points in their native language and also in English**, for better communication of the contents. When mother tongue is English, it is suggested that Power Point presentations include also the text in Spanish. Two projectors will be available, to present simultaneous versions in English and Spanish or Portuguese.
